



MOVIE DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

RAT RACE (Comedy, Rated PG-13)

1. What do you think about the lengths that some of the people in this movie go to in order to actualize their financial dreams?
2. How does money shape our thinking such that crazy, erratic behavior can actually seem sensible?
3. There is a character who has his family involved in the “Rat Race.” Can you think of other situations where people place their families in questionable situations in seeking out financial or social stability?

KRAMER VS. KRAMER (Drama, Rated PG)

1. What do you think about the idea that a person can spend so much time trying to provide for a family that they don't spend time *with* that family? How does our society promote this kind of thinking?
2. There is a lot of frustration in families today. Parents may be so involved with their own issues that they have little reserve left over to deal with their children or even other adults. What are some things that Mrs. Kramer could have done to reconcile her issues?
3. What could have happened differently with the Kramers if they had experienced genuine covenant relationship with others?

THE BOURNE IDENTITY (Action, Rated PG-13)

1. The main character is dealing with not knowing who he is and where he has come from. How do we live like this sometimes? What forms can this take?
2. Bourne ends up finding out that he has all of these interesting abilities and characteristics that he didn't know that he had. How is that just like self-discovery in Christian life? How does the frustration you see in Bourne's understanding of his abilities resound with you?
3. Bourne decides to break from his former life...even though his former life tries to catch up with him. How does Bourne's experience in the movie resonate with your experience in this way?
